ROWING LEVEL 

PROVISIONAL PLANNING

DAY 1

Departure from Cherbourg on Saturday at the beginning of the afternoon, a 20 km tour to Omonville, stay at Omonville for the night.

DAY 2

Return on Sunday morning with a 20 km tour, arrival scheduled at noon in Cherbourg.

Possibility to arrive the day before.

A new route heading to the west! Departing from the yacht harbour in Cherbourg, your Cotentin rowing tour starts with a documented observation of the forts and dams building the biggest artificial bay in Europe. You will either cross the Big Bay from East to West, with the salmon farms in Cherbourg or navigate outside the Big Bay, according to the weather conditions. After leaving the 2nd biggest artificial bay in the world, we will be rowing along the coast and then off the coast at Urville-Nacqueville with the "Raz Bannes" beacon, where you will glimpse the Sentier des Douaniers. La HAGUE comes then with its wild and authentic landscapes, which are often called Little Ireland (probably because they look like the Connemara). The cliff-lined route of 25 km and the Goury beacon erected in the middle of steep rocks build a wild landscape at the world's end. You will discover the more peaceful and green landscapes of the Cotentin, protected by the isolated situation of the tip, and caressed by the wind, which inspired Millet et Prévert. Rocks are everywhere along the coast and are enjoyed by fishers. Beyond this place, you will get to the Port Racine then the Hague cape with the strongest marine currents in Europe.
